EVERGLADES ISLE



Mini Rally Recap by Bob Moss

Driving down Interstate 75 in Southern Florida, one is struck by the beautiful scenery and homes from Ft Myers to Naples. That continues after turning East on FL 41, the Tamiami Trail, and heading toward Miami. But then all the signs of civilization seem to disappear and you find yourself in a rural and surrealistic setting. The road narrows and there is no siding to pull on to. You know you have passed into what is truly Florida when your navigator suddenly shouts “look, an alligator!” Yes, you are now in gator country and you see many of them just lying near the road sunning themselves. You soon realize that they are all on the north side of the road and you later learn that the road you are on runs between the fresh and salt water marshes of Southern Florida. Gators like fresh water and rarely are seen on the south side. Thank goodness because after about 25 miles we turn south and head towards a beautiful RV Park named Everglades Isle.

Located just on the edge of Everglades City, Everglades Isle is a beautiful park with paved roads and large campsites of paver bricks. About half of the sites were waterfront and the continual sight of airboats taking visitors throughout the “Ten Thousand Islands” made for interesting viewing. Twenty-five couples and their coaches were present for the rally. (You can see the attendee list at the Royale Coach Club web site). As usual there were several good places to eat and sightseeing in the almost abandoned town of Everglades City was interesting. When Barron Collier of New York, a wealthy land developer and for whom the County is named, was hired to build the Tamiami Trail from Naples to Miami, he decided to also develop the local community into a city named appropriately Everglades City. But the plan for its success was never achieved. However, the Rod and Gun Club, visited in the past by US Presidents and other dignitaries, is still a tourist resort of nominal interest. The area is now known primarily for its abundance of stone crabs whose claws are eaten all over Florida. So, what did we do? Airboat tours were popular as was a tour by pontoon boat to an outer island inhabited by hundreds of rare white pelicans. For some the accompaniment by dolphins to the island added to the enjoyment. A morning coffee klatch at the coach of Gary and Janie Brethauer grew each day as did a get together around a bon fire at Jim and Nancy

McNulty's coach. Also popular were the videos shown in the beautiful theatre of the campground recreation center. This campground or better described as a motor coach retreat is an excellent place to stop if you are ever in the area. Unlike the busier parks in and around Naples, Everglades Isle is quiet, friendly and close to many sights along the Tamiami Trail.

This review would not be complete without a big shout out to Graham and Mary Catherine Ricks who discovered the resort on their travels and made our stay there possible. Thanks Graham and Mary Catherine.




It was also our Beloved President's, Smitty Schmitz, birthday and of course we just had to celebrate! But wait, where are the rest of the candles??



MURDER OR SUICIDE?

FICTION OR FACTUAL?

At the 1994 annual awards dinner given for Forensic Science, (AAFS) President, and Dr. Don Harper Mills astounded his audience with the legal complications of a bizarre death. Here is the story:

On March 23, the medical examiner viewed the body of Ronald Opus, and concluded that he died from a shotgun wound to the head. Mr. Opus had jumped from the top of a ten-story building intending to commit suicide. He left a note to the effect indicating his despondency. As he fell past the ninth floor, his life was interrupted by a shotgun blast passing through a window, which killed him instantly. Neither the shooter nor the deceased was aware that a safety net had been installed just below the eighth floor level to protect some building workers and that Ronald Opus would not have been able to complete his suicide the way he had planned.

The room on the ninth floor, where the shotgun blast emanated, was occupied by an elderly man and his wife. They were arguing vigorously and he was threatening her with a shotgun! The man was so upset that when he pulled the trigger, he completely missed his wife, and the pellets went through the window, striking Mr. Opus.

When one intends to kill subject 'A' but kills subject 'B' in the attempt, one is guilty of the murder of subject 'B.' When confronted with the murder charge, the old man and his wife were both adamant, and both said that they thought the shotgun was not loaded. The old man said it was a long-standing habit to threaten his wife with the unloaded shotgun. He had no intention to murder her. Therefore the killing of Mr. Opus appeared to be an accident; that is, assuming the gun had been accidentally loaded.

The continuing investigation turned up a witness who saw the old couple's son loading the shotgun about six weeks prior to the fatal accident. It transpired that the old lady had cut off her son's financial support and the son, knowing the propensity of his father to use the shotgun threateningly, loaded the gun with the expectation that his father would shoot his mother. Since the loader of the gun was aware of this, he was guilty of the murder even though he didn't actually pull the trigger. The case now becomes one of murder on the part of the son for the death of Ronald Opus.

Now comes the exquisite twist. Further investigation revealed that the son was, in fact, Ronald Opus. He had become increasingly despondent over the failure of his attempt to engineer his mother's murder. This led him to jump off the ten-story building on March 23rd only to be killed by a shotgun blast passing through the ninth story window. The son, Ronald Opus, had actually murdered himself. So the medical examiner closed the case as a suicide.


